Presentation by Mrs Karen Burch – Chairman of Carmarthenshire Riders group

Members were addressed by Mrs Karen Burch who informed them that the aim of the group was to work with other partners to create safe and off road access for horse riders. The lack of a suitable network capable of being used by horse riders remained a concern and despite large investments into the cycling network, the paths were not available for horse riding. Mrs Burch asked the Members to take the concerns of the riders seriously in all planning application and consultations on travel routes, and to consider supporting the introduction of new bridleways across the area.

The Chair thanked Mrs Burch and two colleagues who attended with her for their attendance.

It was **resolved** that the Clerk should write to Carmarthenshire County Council to obtain an up to date map of bridleways and bye ways open to all traffic in the Council area, and to enquire if there were any decommissioned bridleways which could potentially be reopened.

Proposed new speed hump at Caerbryn

As part of the Cross Hands to Llandybie Phase 2 shared footpath scheme, it is proposed to provide a raised plateau road hump on B4556 Penygroes Road, Caerbryn. The raised plateau is considered necessary in the interest of road safety to maintain low vehicle speeds.

Members **resolved** to inform the County Council that they had no objection to the proposed scheme.

Deposit Revised Local Development Plan

A letter had been received from Carmarthenshire County Council to inform Members that the document had been published for consultation.

The DRLDP sets out the land policies and proposals including the allocation of land through to 2033. The plan is very comprehensive and will be adopted before the end of 2021.

The consultation will be available between the 29th January, 2020 and 13th March, 2020, and there will also be public drop in sessions run throughout February.

GILFACH IAGO

A letter had been received from Ruth Mullen, Director of Environment at Carmarthenshire County Council. The letter states that throughout the longstanding negotiations with Celtic Energy, the Community Council had chosen not to accept Celtic Energy's offer. The Clerk's inference in his previous letter that the Community Council had 'never declined any offer' was incorrect, as she had stated that the Council had 'not accepted' the offer, and that this had a completely different meaning.

The Clerk had written to remind her that costings for the work were still awaited, and what the current update was from Celtic Energy for commencing the work. An update on the progress of the application the for footpath diversions had also been requested.

CLERK'S REPORT

a) Public Rights of Way

Chai

i) A large branch had fallen and blocked footpath 51/56 during the recent inclement weather. Dynevor Tree Services had satisfactorily cut up and removed the branch and an invoice for £ 100 had been received.

b) Service Level Agreement for grass cutting, litter collection and general park maintenance (Lot 1), plus maintenance of Llandybie Bowling Green (Lot 3).

The Clerk had met with Gareth Howells of Carmarthenshire County Council to discuss the possible extension of the SLA for a further twelve months. Both parties had been happy with the previous agreement and subject to very minor changes in terms of the schedule of work required, it had been agreed to renew the agreement. Total cost of the contract from 1/4/20 to 31/3/21 will be £20810.01 for Lot 1 and £6561 for Lot 3.

It was **resolved** to accept the costings for 2020/2021.

c) Quotations for Park Inspections

Two quotations had been received for monthly operational park inspections, and a third contractor had informed the Clerk that they did not wish to quote.

Having discussed the quotations with the Chair, the contract had been awarded to Sunshine Playgrounds Ltd for a 2 year period commencing on the 1st February, 2020 at a cost of £2430.

It was **resolved** to confirm the decision of the Chair and Clerk.

d) Register of contractors

A bilingual advert had been placed in the South Wales Guardian at a cost of £297.36 including VAT, asking for any contractor to make an 'Expression of Interest' to be considered across various potential works that would be needed. Responses had been received from a number of businesses, all of which had been added to the Council's list of potential contractors.

e) Office lights

A faulty light in the office had needed to be replaced at a cost of £96. The work had been satisfactorily completed by DJ Electrical and the invoice had been paid with the agreement of the Chair.

f) Cleaning of Llandybie pavilion guttering

The guttering at Llandybie pavilion had been satisfactorily cleaned by Peter Holley at a cost of £90 with no VAT charged. The invoice had been paid with the agreement of the Chair.

g) Overhanging trees at Penygroes park

Trees overlanging the benches overlooking the children's play area had been assessed as a danger to the public in a recent park inspection. Dynevor Tree Services had satisfactorily completed the work of cutting back the branches at a cost of £150.

h) Llandybie Public Conveniences

A blocked drain had been cleared by Jeff's Tipper Hire at a cost of £25 with no VAT charged.

It was **resolved** to retrospectively confirm the decision to pay the items shown at (a),(e),(f), (g) and (h) above.

i) Penybanc Park

The Clerk had asked Carmarthenshire County Council to isolate the Multi Play (Senior) item of equipment at Penybanc park. The recent park inspection had identified a number of concerns and the recommendation from the inspector was that it should be isolated to prevent it being used.

In addition to this equipment, the wet pour surface is in very poor condition with moss and algae, and the edges of the surfacing have come away from the kerbs causing trip hazards. The pathways leading from the main gate to the equipment are also in need of repair. The tree surround to the park is undoubtedly adding to the problems being faced.

The Clerk recommended that costings be obtained to establish the cost of resurfacing under the equipment and paths, and for the replacement of the isolated High Risk climbing frame.

Members **resolved** to accept this recommendation but that prior to any decision the ward Councillors undertake a local survey

j) Park inspection improvements

The Parks and Play Areas committee had authorised park improvement work in July 2019 and a contractor had been appointed to complete the work. Illness had prevented the work being done and recent inspections had identified the poor condition of swings and chains at most of the parks and that they needed to be changed to prevent further chain wear and broken seats in future.

The Clerk had arranged to purchase 12 new cradle and flat swings, suitable link chains and other shackles and pins at a cost of £1395 including VAT and arranged

with a local park maintenance contractor to fit. There had also been number of other issues identified on the inspection reports relating to rust and timber care, which the Clerk had agreed for the work to be done.

It was **resolved** that this work should proceed.
