Projects for 2019-20

a) The Clerk reported that he had received a number of requests for suitable projects during the next financial year. It was agreed to **recommend** to Council that the projects listed below be considered as part of the Community Development programme for 2019-2020.

1. Provision of wild flower mats at various locations – on roads and in parks
2. Provision of pavement to one side of Aberlash Road
3. Heart of Wales walking trail notice board
4. Plant native trees in parks that are deemed suitable
5. Signage on main roads to indicate the presence of the parks
6. Signage within each park to highlight ownership
7. Sponsorship plaques indicating work done by who and when
8. Dog mess / Dogs on lead signage
9. Floodlighting at Penygroes park
10. Improvements at Llandybie station

b) Projects involving speed humps at the following locations were discussed and it was **recommended** that the Highways department of the County Council be asked for a traffic assessment on all sites. The Clerk was asked to approach the County Councillors representing the wards, for them to make the initial enquiry.

- a) Kings Road, Llandybie
- b) Pantyblodau Road, Blaenau
- c) Nanyt y Ci Road, Saron
- d) Black Lion Road

c) It was further **recommended** that £30000 be earmarked for the and maintenance and repair of the parks.

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d) A request from Cwmgwili Welfare Hall Association for financial support to help with structural improvements to the hall was considered. It was **recommended** that the welfare association submit a full proposal for consideration by the Council to include full costings, other supporting funders involved and the level of support required from the Council.
